

CLA announces support for UK schools and colleges

Copyright Licensing Agency relaxes copyright licence terms to support educators through COVID-19 crisis.

UK schools, sixth form and further education colleges given more flexible access and can copy increased amount of book content.

We are delighted to announce that following consultation with our Members and educational publishers, ~~we have temporarily increased the copying~~ limits in our licence from 5% to 30%.

These changes will be in place until schools re-open or until 31st July, whichever is sooner, to give teachers and students greater access to learning resources during this difficult period.

These changes to the licence terms mean that schools can now:

- copy up to 30% of a print book, including scanned book content held on a VLE
- use books owned personally by teachers in addition to school-owned books up to the 30% limit.

To monitor usage, teachers are asked to record details of any copies that they make under these new terms via a simple [web-form](#) made available by CLA.

Schools and teachers that are registered to use CLA's [Education Platform](#) are able to copy up to 30% from books available on the Platform. To register at no additional cost to your school go to www.educationplatform.co.uk/register

We believe that this initiative, with special acknowledgement to the generosity of educational publishers, can provide the much-needed support that educators need in delivering remote learning to students.
