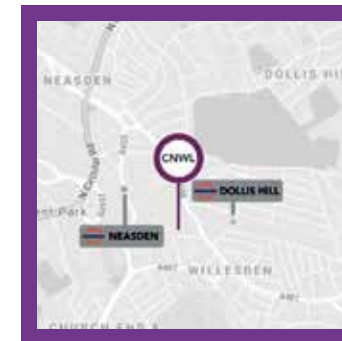

Willesden

The College's main and largest campus, the Willesden campus, is situated in North West London. Bright and vibrant, the campus offers a range of cutting-edge facilities, exciting courses and a warm, welcoming atmosphere.

The campus is near Dollis Hill and Neasden tube stations (about 5 minutes' walk from either), both on the Jubilee Line.

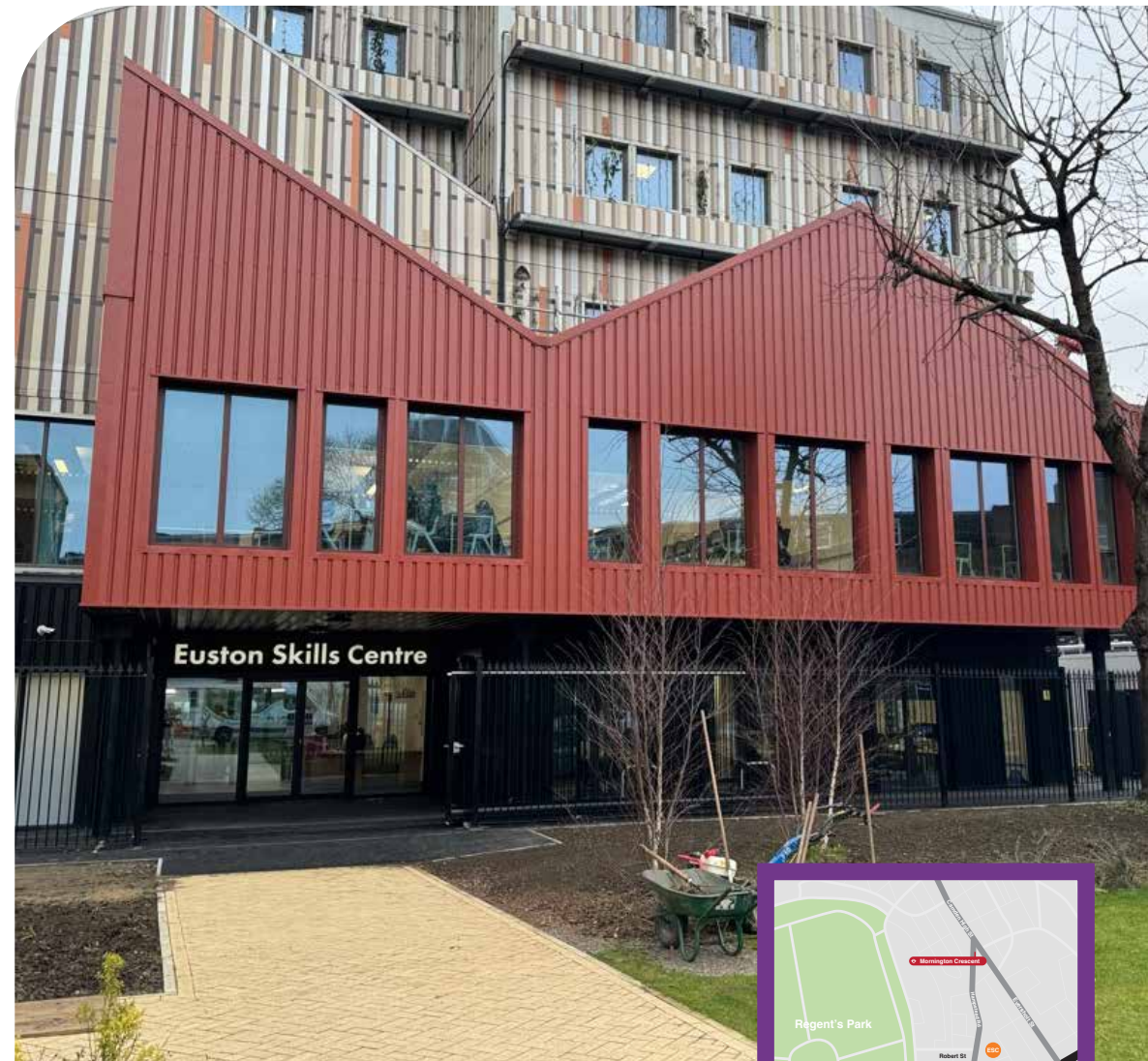


Wembley Park

Situated in one of London's most exciting cultural neighbourhoods, our Wembley campus is near London's most iconic concert venue – the SSE Arena and the world-famous National Stadium. The campus offers great access to a wide range of local amenities,

transportation links and the Wembley Box Park.

The campus is a stone's throw away from Wembley Park (1 minute walk – the College is just over the road) with connections for the Metropolitan, Jubilee and Chiltern lines.



Euston Skills Centre

An innovative new learning hub offering courses in Construction, our Euston Skills Centre is in partnership with Camden Council and is situated north of Euston Station.

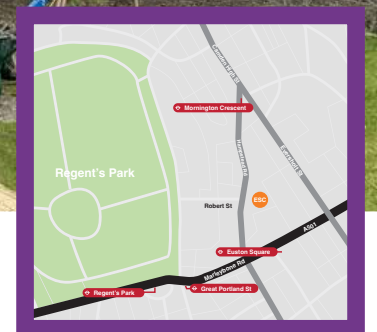
The centre is a really practical space – with classrooms, CSCS test

centre, a dedicated workshop space including specialist machinery rooms and an outside training area where students learn practical skills as part of their qualifications.

Air Source Heat Pumps, Solar Thermal and PV and Electric Vehicle charging

equipment are used to support the delivery of a curriculum offering a range of accredited and non-accredited training for students, apprentices and the development of existing staff.

The campus is a 5 minute walk from Euston Station.

Qualifications Explained

We offer a diverse and exciting range of vocational and practical courses for you to choose from.

Apprenticeships

An Apprenticeship is a job combined with training so you can earn a wage while you learn and gain recognised qualifications. Training takes place at your workplace and in college but in some cases all training is provided in the workplace, with tutors visiting you. To do an Apprenticeship, you must already be in suitable employment or have an offer of employment within your chosen occupation.

NVQs

National Vocational Qualifications

(NVQs) are vocational awards achieved through assessment and training, usually in the workplace. These are competence-based qualifications where people learn practical, work-related tasks to help develop the skills and knowledge to increase their effectiveness.

BTEC, UAL, NCFE, CACHE, City & Guilds, IMI Certificates/ Diplomas

These are courses with a vocational focus recommended for those interested in a particular area of study

e.g., Performing Arts or Information Technology. They are coursework-based qualifications with very few or no exams and are continually assessed in order for you to review and improve your performance.

BTEC Level 3 Extended Diplomas

are delivered as two one-year programmes:

Year 1 – Subsidiary Diploma

Year 2 – Diploma/Extended Diploma
students are expected to satisfactorily complete the Subsidiary Diploma programme prior to being considered

for the Diploma or Extended Diploma.

HNCs, HNDs & Foundation Degrees

Higher National Certificates (HNCs) and Higher National Diplomas (HNDs) are university level qualifications, designed to give you specialist knowledge in your chosen field. Foundation degrees are equivalent to the first two years of a degree and combine vocational and academic study. Foundation degrees, HNCs and HNDs can lead to top-up degrees at a partner or participating University.

Finding the Right Course Level

ENTRY LEVEL

If you have no formal qualifications then this could be a good place to start. Our ESOL courses are at Entry Level and are designed to give you an understanding of the English language in preparation for a higher level course.

LEVEL 1

Level 1 courses provide a general introduction to skills, tasks and knowledge. If you have at least 2 GCSEs at grade 2/E or above or an Entry Level qualification, then a Level 1 qualification might be the right level for you.

LEVEL 2

If you have 4 GCSEs at grade 3/D or above or a Level 1 qualification, you could apply for a Level 2 course. Once completed, Level 2 courses are the equivalent of 4-5 GCSEs at grade 4/C or above.

LEVEL 3

Level 3 courses will further develop your knowledge and understanding of your chosen subject area. They generally last two years and enable you to earn UCAS points to go onto university or into employment. If you have at least 4 GCSEs at grade 9-4/A*-C or a Level 2 qualification then you should be aiming at studying a Level 3 course.

LEVEL 4 AND ABOVE

These courses fall into the category of Higher Education and are equivalent to courses taught at universities. They help you gain specialist knowledge and understanding of a specific subject.



Your Study Programme

Your study programme is specially designed to help give you the best possible start to your career.

Alongside your main qualification, you'll study English and Maths, complete work experience and take part in enrichment activities to improve your personal and employability skills.

1. Your main qualification (in the subject area of your choice)
You will still study the same post-school qualifications for

your particular subject area (i.e. you'll go in at level 2 and work up to level 3 in the traditional way). You could be training to become a hairdresser or taking an engineering study programme to become an electrician.

2. Development of employability skills and relevant work experience
When it's time for you to apply

for a job, you will be well prepared with a great CV, real-life work experience and solid interview techniques. We'll help you navigate the job market and overcome any interview process nerves.

3. Both personal and professional development
Want to know how you're progressing? We will assign you



English, Maths & Skills

If you are a school leaver and aged 16 – 18, you will be taking a Study Programme, which will include your main academic (A-Levels) or vocational (T Level or BTEC) subjects along with tutorial time, work experience relevant to your subject of study, and depending on your GCSE grades, a combination of English, Maths or Skills lessons.

a personal development tutor to support you through your time and track your progress.

4. The study of English and Maths.

Employees will want to know that your level of English and Maths are of a sufficient level regardless of the career you embark on. For example, if you're an aspiring construction

worker, you'll need to know how to calculate distances and estimate or if you would like to work in catering and hospitality, you'll need to know how to handle money and write emails. Of course, the level of numerical knowledge you need will vary depending on your chosen subject (accounting students will learn at a higher level for example).

Financial Support

Learner Support Fund/ Bursary

Bursary is financial support allocated to the college for students who are from low-income households. The support offered is subject to eligibility but can include travel expenses, college meals, textbooks, tuition fees and more. Courses, levels, age, and travel distances are some factors that may cause entitlement to vary. To apply for Bursary, you will need to complete an online application form. Advanced Learner Loan

To be eligible for this loan, you need to have been living continuously in the UK for three years immediately before the start date of your course. You must also be undertaking a course of study at Level 3 or above, e.g. A levels, National Diploma/Certificate. For more information, visit: gov.uk/advancedlearner-loan

Advanced Learner Loan - Additional Support

If you are approved for the Advanced Learner Loan, you may also be eligible for childcare and financial support towards course-associated costs from the Advanced Learner Loan Bursary. You must be in receipt of a minimum of £300 Advanced Learner Loan or receive the maintenance portion of the Student Finance Loan to receive the Bursary.

Higher Education Courses

Finances shouldn't be a barrier to education. We're passionate about ensuring education is accessible to everyone so we offer a range of support packages to help finance your studies and support you during your course.

Course Fees

Your course fees, if any, will depend upon your personal circumstances such as your residential status (home or international), age, whether you are in receipt of benefits and/or seeking work and the course itself and how it is funded.

16-18 Year Olds

All our Entry to Level 3 courses are free to UK, EU and EEA* residents who are under 19 years old on the 31st August. For some specific courses, you may be expected to contribute towards the cost of specialist materials and resources. However depending on the circumstances you may be eligible for financial help from the College's Learner Support Fund.

Adults

If you are aged 19 or over on the 31st August you will normally be required to pay a course fee. However, there are some exceptions for UK/EU or EEA* residents.

What will the cost of my course include?

The cost of your course will include tuition fees and examination fees where applicable. Where a course requires additional specialist materials there may be an additional cost. Some courses are cheaper than others because they are part funded by the government, some of these courses may also attract concessionary fees for some people.

Apply on Time!

Confirmation

Once you've submitted your application, we'll send you an email to confirm we've received it.

Attend an Interview

Once we've received your application, and if you're suitable for the course, you'll be invited for an interview or be made an offer, depending on the entry criteria for the course you have applied for.

Enrol

You'll be invited to enrol at the College of North West London, after which, you'll become an official student at the College.



Apprenticeships

An apprenticeship is a great alternative to full-time study. Combining practical training in a real job with study towards a nationally recognised qualification, harness the benefits of earning while you learn from day one.

Why choose an apprenticeship?

- Earn while you learn
- Get paid holidays
- Gain nationally recognised qualifications
- Learn job-specific skills
- Benefit from progression opportunities
- Increase your future earning potential
- Learn at a pace suited to you
- Get support from a workplace mentor

Am I eligible?

Apprenticeships are open to anyone aged 16 or above, living in the UK and not in full-time education and employed. If you're not a UK citizen, but you have the right to work in the UK and the Apprenticeship works within the lines of your visa, you can pursue an Apprenticeship.

There are four main Apprenticeship levels:

Intermediate Level Apprenticeships - Level 2 (equivalent to GCSEs)

Advanced Level Apprenticeships – Level 3 (equivalent to A levels)

Higher Apprenticeships – Levels 4, 5 (equivalent to Foundation degree and above)

Degree Apprenticeships – Levels 6, 7 (equivalent to Bachelor's or Master's Degree)

What qualifications do I need?

Level 2 (Intermediate), equivalent to GCSEs, you must be 16 years old or over. Employers may ask for a demonstrable interest in the area covered by the apprenticeship, as well as the ability to complete it

Level 3 (Advanced), considered equivalent to A-levels, at this level, employers will typically seek GCSEs, usually three or more, particularly in English and Maths. Relevant experience will also be useful.

Level 4 (Higher) considered equivalent to a foundation

degree, employers will look for GCSEs and level 3 qualifications, such as A levels, or their equivalents, such as a BTEC. It's at this point where experience in a relevant subject is also desired.

All Apprenticeship candidates will be required to undertake Maths and English assessments as part of the onboarding process and admission onto the course is subject to meeting the entry criteria.

What's next?

If you're interested in an apprenticeship, you'll need to find a suitable job and an employer willing to support you through it. For vacancies, visit Find an Apprenticeship findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk and register your details. You can also contact your local council.

How long does an apprenticeship last?

Apprenticeships vary in length depending on the qualification, level, sector and your previous experience. They can be from one year to up to four years.

T-LEVELS

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

T Levels are a two-year qualification designed to give you a head start towards the career you want.

New courses, which follow GCSEs and are equivalent to three A Levels, a T Level focuses on vocational skills and can help students into skilled employment, University or apprenticeships.

T Level students spend 80% of the course in their learning environment, gaining the skills that employers need. The other 20% is a meaningful industry placement, where they put these skills into action.

Each T Level includes an in-depth industry placement that lasts at least 45 days. Students get valuable experience in the workplace; employers get early sight of the new talent in their industry.

T Levels at City of Westminster College include:

- Accounting
- Design and Development for Engineering and Manufacturing
- Design, Surveying and Planning for Construction
- Digital Production, Design and Development
- Education and Childcare
- Health
- Management and Administration
- Science

T Levels at College of North West London include:

Where a student has previously achieved either GCSE grade 3 or they have achieved Functional

Skills Level 1, they are enrolled to a one-year GCSE programme. Most employers expect their staff to have a GCSE in English and Maths at grade 4 or above.

Courses and progression routes Profound and Complex Needs

These courses are for sensory learners who follow a highly individualised

curriculum based on the principles of intensive interaction in order to develop the fundamentals of communication and relationships, and to have a presence in the community.

Progression

Students are expected to progress onto the course 'From Living to Learning', or Adult Social Care funded provision or adult education courses.

Independent Living Skills

The purpose of these courses is to build on existing knowledge and to further develop skills towards independent living and work. Each aspect of the course is tailored to the individual participants to suit their specific needs.

Progression

Students may progress onto a course at a higher level or Adult Social Care funded provision.

Employability

On these courses, students will develop their understanding of the world of work, and develop the skills, personal attributes and confidence needed to secure paid employment in the future. They will be working at Entry Level in literacy and numeracy and will be expected to be independent travellers or to work towards this. They will access a variety of enterprise and work-based learning experiences.

Progression

Students will be looking to progress onto a Pre or Supported internship, paid employment or a college course at a higher level.

Pre-Supported Internship

This is a one year course with students spending two days per week doing external work experience to prepare them to progress to a Supported Internship or other work place opportunities.

Supported Internship

These courses are for young people aged 16-24 with a SEND and an Education, Health & Care Plan. They are intended to enable students to find sustainable, substantial, paid employment at the end of the course, by equipping them with the skills they need through learning in the host employer's workplace. Students are supported by a job coach and tutors. Interns must be independent travellers or working towards this.
